RAISN Member Spotlight:

Kathryn Wiseman, AuD, PhD,

Dr. Wiseman is a post-doctoral research fellow at Boys Town National Research Hospital in the Audibility, Perception, and Cognition lab with Dr.

Ryan McCreery. Her research focuses on improving clinical guidelines for children with hearing loss who use auditory technology (e.g., hearing aids, cochlear implants). She earned her clinical and research doctorates (Au.D./Ph.D.) at the University of Texas at Dallas. During her graduate studies, her work in the Children and Infant Listening Lab with Dr. Andrea Warner-Czyz centered on understanding variability in speech, language, and auditory outcomes in children with cochlear implants.




Dr. Wiseman and her colleagues recently published the article "Relationships between daily device use and early communication outcomes in young children with cochlear implants." The authors used datalogging measurements to examine daily cochlear implant use in children under 5 years old. The results showed that children who wore their cochlear implants more hours per day had better language, speech perception, and early auditory skills compared to those who wore them fewer hours. This study also highlighted certain characteristics that put children at risk for poorer device use (e.g., presence of additional disabilities).
